How you can help at home..

Maths

You can help to develop children's maths skills at home

- Notice and comment upon groups of 1, 2 and 3
 For example -when your child has , for example 3 sausages on their plate
- Encourage your child to sort items in different ways- put the white clothes in one pile and the colourful ones in another pile. Etc.
- Continue to Notice 2D shapes such as circles, square and triangle around your home.
 "Look, the clock face is a circle"

Talking

Please continue to talk to your child about anything and everything.

Take every opportunity to include your children in activities around the home and outside.

Get them to help to wash the car, and talk about what you are doing / why it is nice to have a clean car.

Socialise with friends, neighbours and family and whenever possible'

Reading and Writing

- Please ensure you get in to habit of bringing the folder in regularly, in Reception class children are expected to bring their reading folders to school every day.
- Try to provide lots of opportunities for your child to make marks. In Summer a bowl of water and some cheap paintbrushes can keep children entertained for ages! Notice how it dries and disappears faster in the sunshine.
