## **Review of the Parental Survey - October 2019**



The following data is a representation from 50 surveys being completed and returned following parents' evening in October 2019.


The school supports 250 children in their primary education journey. The percentage of surveys returned can only reflect this percentage; we encourage all parents and carers to complete the survey in order to gather as much feedback as is possible. This feedback is important, as it allows us to consider actions to take going forward, but also celebrate key outcomes.
