R.E and Collective Worship:

- **Pentecost** We will discuss how good news brings life and how the new life of the Easter message is spread through the power of the Holy Spirit.
- **Reconciliation** We will learn about the importance of admitting wrong and being reconciled with God and one another.
- Multi-Faith Week The children will gain a better understanding of other faiths including Judaism and Islam.
